## La petite chouette de Notre-Dame


Sculpted on the foothills of Notre-Dame church, this small wooden owl who gave its name to the street is a reflection, knowledge and clear-sightedness symbol. It's a good omen. We caress it with the left-hand – heart side – to make a wish. The Black cat and the earthenware eagle-owl on the roof are also lucky-charms as well as the salamander, Francois 1st emblem.


